## Message from Eleanor

Dear Friends

I am absolutely delighted to be here at The New Wellwynd for my probationary period – my final placement before ordination. You have all made me feel so welcome.

I thought I'd give you a potted history of me and my life. I'm Eleanor and I'm 25 plus postage & packing! I currently live in Hamilton so not too far away. I live with my daughter Emma who works in a gym and is training to be a personal trainer, my mum and my very large, fluffy dog Miko, a Samoyed we rescued from Siberia, who as I type, is lying snoring at my feet – that is usually where he can be found.

Before entering training for full-time ministry, I worked for 21 years in HMRC. Latterly I worked in fraud, as a VAT inspector. My home church is Moncrieff Parish Church in East Kilbride where I have been since I was 15. I was a Sunday school teacher and bible class leader for 30 years (ooh giving the age away now) as well as being on the Board.

I studied at Highland Theological College which is part of The University of the Highlands and Islands and although I enjoyed my studies, I am glad it's over! I was never a natural scholar and as you've heard me say my report card would be 'talk less, listen more.' I have had placements in Jackson Church in Airdrie, the Presbytery Office and St Mary's in Motherwell. I have been the locum at Cambusnethan North for the last 9 months.

In my spare time, I am involved in a panto club in East Kilbride, I crochet and love musical theatre. I'm really enjoying my time with you all so far and I can't believe that as I write almost a month has already passed.

Lent is almost upon us, and as we embark on this Lenten journey, we are reminded of God's call in our lives. Just as Jesus called his disciples to follow him, we too are called to walk in the footsteps of Christ. This call is not always easy to discern amidst the noise and distractions of the world, but it is a call rooted in love and purpose. Lent invites us to pause, reflect, and listen attentively to God's voice speaking to us in the depths of our hearts. It is a time to re-evaluate our priorities, to let go of the things that hinder our relationship with God, and to make room for new beginnings.

#### Narrative of Generosity and Relationships



# Listening to God



Why do people use headphones?

One reason people use headphones is to hear something better. If it's noisy around you, you can put your headphones in and hear what you're listening to.

That's kind of what we need to do if we want to hear God speaking to us.

In the Bible, there was a little boy named Samuel. He lived at the Tabernacle serving Eli the priest. One night, God called to Samuel. "Samuel," God said. But Samuel didn't know it was God calling him. He thought it was the priest, Eli. So, he got up and went to Eli's room.

But Eli said he didn't call him, so he sent Samuel back to bed. God called Samuel two more times, and Samuel kept thinking it was Eli calling him. Finally, Eli figured out that God was calling Samuel. He told Samuel that the next time God called him, Samuel should say...




"Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening."
