OUR STAINED GLASS WINDOWS -

During a routine inspection, the Congregational Board have been advised that three of our Stained Glass Windows on the pulpit side of the church will require some urgent repair and maintenance work to be undertaken. Unfortunately, this work cannot be done within the building here, so each window will be removed to the contractor's studio one by one over a period of time.

The first, the Nativity window (second window from the back) has been removed last week and will be in the studio for up to 6 weeks.

This work has to be undertaken by a specialist and is time consuming, so comes at a large cost to us. As a result, some other projects or work may have to be rescheduled to a later date.
