Dear Friends,

I think that the phrase, "I'm going to meet myself coming back", is probably a good description of me this morning! 

Jim put his empty pot on the floor and many of his colleagues laughed. A few felt sorry for him! When the CEO arrived, he surveyed the room and greeted his young executives.
